This annual service is organized by the Rev. Barbara E. Davis, Minister of Education, in celebration of World Poetry Day (March 21) and in remembrance of the three-year anniversary of the start of the war in Iraq (March 19).

Music Notes

At the 11:00 a.m. Service on **Sunday, March 5**, the Children's Choirs, under the direction of Faye Timmer, and the Adult Choir will sing at the Introit, "All That Has Life," by Betty Ann Ramseth. This introit will be sung antiphonally from the balconies, and the **newly acquired hand chimes** will be introduced for the first time in worship. The hand chimes, which are similar to hand bells, are a wonderful addition to the music program and will enhance many anthems that require the sound of hand bells.

In March, Dr. Entriken will present recitals on two recently installed organs in New York. On **Sunday, March 5, at 3:00 p.m.**, Dr. Entriken will perform at St. Vincent Ferrer on Lexington Avenue at 64th Street. The organ, built by the Schantz Organ Company (2002), has a console that can be moved to the crossing so that the audience has a full view of the performer, which is unusual for organ concerts.

On **Tuesday, March 14, at 12:30 p.m.**, Dr. Entriken will give a recital on the Casavant Organ (2002) at Central Synagogue, located on Lexington Avenue at 55th Street. In addition, he will give a **Master Class at 10:30 a.m.** that morning, which is open to the public. All events are free.

On **Sunday, April 30, at 4:00 p.m.** the Choir, Soloists and Orchestra of First Presbyterian will present in a Vesper Service of Music, "Grand Mass in C Minor," by Mozart.

To Holmes! The Membership & Fellowship Committee is sponsoring an overnight/day trip to Holmes Camp, a beautiful retreat facility on over 500 acres north of the City, near Brewster, New York. You can go up either Friday night, April 28, or up and back on the same day, Saturday, April 29.

Those who choose to go on Friday will spend the night in a cozy hotel at Holmes, the Agape. We'll have dinner, sit around the fire, sing, and just relax. On Saturday morning, early risers will take a hike around the premises. Those of us who take the bus up on Saturday or drive our own cars will arrive around 10 a.m. Together we'll then be led in informal devotions for about an hour, followed by boating on the lake (weather permitting). We'll enjoy a wonderful Holmes lunch, and in the early afternoon, we'll break up into small groups to play various outdoor sports, hike the grounds, or do some indoor sports like Bridge and reading! Around 4 p.m. we'll return to the City.

The cost for this outing is reasonable. For three meals (d,b&l) and a hotel room, Holmes asks \$150 for two people in a room, \$95 for one person. [Each room has a double bed, a twin bed, and a rollaway, so the whole family could come!] If you want to go up and back in the same day (Saturday), our Membership/Fellowship committee has rented a bus. It will leave from the front of the church at 9 a.m. on Saturday morning. To defray costs, the Committee is asking bus riders for a voluntary contribution of \$10 per person (children under 12 are free), and this includes lunch on Saturday! One Great Hour of Sharing Offering

It's Lent again. Time for us to participate in One Great Hour of Sharing. In the next few weeks you will see the envelopes for this offering placed in the pews and you may wonder, "What does this mean?"

One Great Hour of Sharing began in 1949 after World War II, an effort to begin to repair the devastation wrought by that war. Now, 55 years later, we are still dealing with devastation both in our country and abroad. As Christians we are called to reach out, and our donations are one way to do this.

Our gifts go in three directions. Three programs—Self-Development of People, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, and the Presbyterian Hunger Program—each get 32% of this offering. The remaining 4% goes to the Hunger Program for its work on homelessness and affordable housing, both needs that we New Yorkers



know well are urgent ones in our city and across the country.

I will never forget the pictures of the Katrina victims stranded on the rooftops of their homes last summer or the villagers in Pakistan shivering in the frigid cold after the earthquake shook their region last fall. Each year brings us new challenges as Christians. Each year our gifts for One Great Hour of Sharing help rebuild societies over the long term in ways that may not make headlines, but that fill in the gaps left by other relief efforts. As you prepare your gift this Lenten season, remember Christ's words in Matthew 25: As you helped the most vulnerable of my brothers and sisters, you were helping me.
