## Building for the Future

What ever happened to those talks with the congregation about the need for improvement in our facilities, a need precipitated by growing numbers in the church, educational facilities that are aging, and the need to expand our outreach to the community? Last year several meetings were held with the congregation to request ideas and to hear concerns, but not a lot has been said since. In reality, a Design and Construction Committee under the oversight of both the Session and Trustees has been diligently working to move the ideas and concerns expressed from concept to reality. Chaired by Elder Richard Rice, a professional architect, members of both boards, staff members, and representatives of the congregation at large have continued to consider the concerns generated by the congregation and distill them into a Request for Proposal to be distributed to interested and qualified architectural firms.

During January, those firms will receive that RFP and present bids on developing the project.

The Design Committee discovered that in addition to the space currently available in the Mellin-Macnab Building, the church will need an additional 10,000 square feet of space. Where to locate that additional space has been a significant challenge for the committee, and some creative and expansive visions for development have been proposed. The additional rooms and renovations will provide for a more spacious and attractive Nursery School and school for autistic children, add more classrooms for youth and older children, provide adequate storage, which is sorely lacking now, and combine administrative offices into a coordinated central location. Public spaces, such as the lobby, and gathering areas will be

## Annual Congregational Meeting on January 28

The annual meeting of the congregation and corporation of The First Presbyterian Church in the City of New York will be held following the morning worship service and an all-member brunch on Sunday, January 28, 2007, in the Great Hall, on the second floor of the South Wing.

The business meeting will begin at approximately 1:15 p.m. in the church sanctuary and will last about an hour. The purpose of the meeting is to elect officers, to receive reports of the joint boards on financial results for 2006, and to review the 2007 budget. A printed Annual Report, including reports from the ministers, boards, and committees, will be available Sunday, January 21, for review before the meeting.

The Nominating Committee, elected by the congregation last January, has been working diligently to prepare a slate of officers to serve on the Session, the Board of Deacons, and the Board of Trustees to replace elders, deacons, and trustees who are retiring this year. This slate of officers will appear in the Annual Report.

There will be no coffee hour that Sunday. Visitors are welcome to attend the brunch and meeting, although only Active Members are eligible to vote. To reserve your place for brunch, please sign up in the lobby of the Mellin-Macnab Building. A free-will donation will be taken at the brunch.

made more accommodating and spacious, and the buildings will be air-conditioned and climate-controlled to provide a more healthful and clean environment. Air conditioning will mean that our school for autistic children will be able to operate twelve months of the year, a long sought-after goal. Additional space within the building will mean that the church can be an even more hospitable host to organizations and people within the community who look to the church for help and support of their service to others.

Funding of this project must come from the congregation, so planning is taking into consideration the financial potential of the congregation to support a major capital improvement. Early in the new year the Session will consider how best to prepare for that challenge. Professional fund-raising expertise will be sought to help determine an achievable financial goal, and plans for building improvement will fit into a larger plan for financing which will be developed. For the time being, the important thing is simply to be aware that more information will be on its way in 2007 as the Session, Trustees, and Design and Construction Committee move forward with planning. If you have questions, please do not hesitate to contact one of the officers of the church or a member of the Design and Construction Committee. Your awareness and involvement will be key to the successful outcome of all this planning.
