## Ash Wednesday

On Ash Wednesday, February 21, we officially mark the beginning of the Lenten season. There will be two communion services at First Church: midday prayers at 12:00 noon and an evening service at 7:00 p.m. in the sanctuary. Dr. Jon M. Walton will preach.

Also on Ash Wednesday, the midday and vespers services will include the imposition of ashes, an ancient sign of the frailty and uncertainty of human life. The Presbyterian *Book of Common Worship* provides for the imposition of ashes as a ritual that belongs to the whole church, not just to the more "liturgical" churches. At the service, those who wish to participate will be invited to come forward for marking the forehead with the sign of the cross and the words from Genesis 3:19, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Ash Wednesday is a day of repentance, but it is also a call to reflection, meditation, prayer, and preparation. We prepare and turn toward God, so that we are ready for the renewal that awaits us. It is the prayer of the Psalmist that puts our wish to words: "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me." (Ps. 51:10)

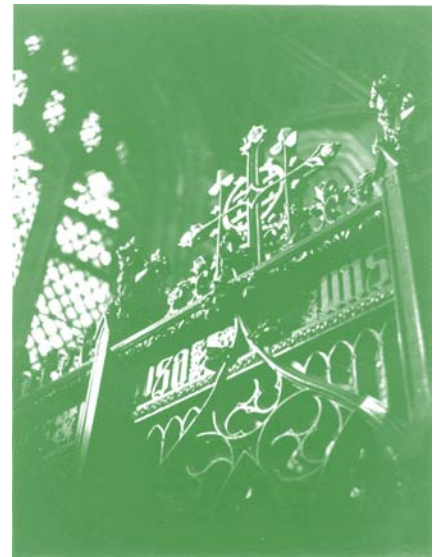

Children as young as those in middle school can sign up, so if you have children give this trip serious consideration. The work will involve all kinds of home repair for people who cannot afford to hire contractors. The group will live in the church house of Montgomery Presbyterian Church in dormitory rooms with bunk beds and will cook their own food. The dates will be from Saturday, July 7, through Saturday, July 14, with Wednesday off for recreation. The approximate cost per person will be \$690.
