Changing *First Notes*

In Luke's account of the commissioning of the twelve apostles, Jesus advised his first followers to go out into the world and... "Take nothing for your journey, no staff, nor bag, nor bread, nor money—not even an extra tunic" (Luke 9:3). It was an auspicious start for the Christian enterprise because it signaled two things: communication of the gospel would be *interpersonal* and *underwriting the work would be a challenge*. In the midst of this economic downturn, the postal service has forced on the church the latest in a series of difficult decisions that will change our way of communicating once again. In recent years we have reduced the number of *Church Tower* publications. Several years ago we stopped producing our Sunday morning radio pro-

gram on WQXR, *Be Thou My Vision*, and we also stopped publishing weekly advertisements of worship services in *The New York Times*. This meant that we have had to rely more on the printed and mailed version of *First Notes* and our website, www.fpcnyc.org, as the primary means of communicating church activities.

In January of this year the US Postal Service informed us that the folded format of *First Notes* would cause an increase from forty-four cents per piece to sixty-one cents per piece. A nearly forty percent rise in mailing exceeds our budget for 2010, so our Communications Committee has had to make some difficult decisions in order to live within our budget. The result will

IN SHORT...

...Will I continue to receive *First Notes* in the mail?

No; unless you specifically request a mailing from the Church, this March 2010 issue will be the last hard copy mass mailing of *First Notes*.

...Why is the church no longer mass mailing *First Notes*?

The U.S. Postal Service has raised the price of mailing a *First Notes* issue by nearly 40%, an increase that would put an undue strain on the church's budget. FPC is also taking this opportunity to conserve paper resources.

...How can I access *First Notes* if I'm no longer receiving it through the mail?

First Notes is available online at <http://www.fpcnyc.org/sermons-media/first-notes.html>. Hard copies will be available for pick up each month in the Mellin-Macnab lobby and the Narthex. MUSIC FOR LENT AT FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

REQUIEM W. A. MOZART SUNDAY, MARCH 14 AT 4:00 P.M.

On Sunday, March 14, at 4:00 p.m., the Soloists, Choir and Orchestra of First Presbyterian Church will present Mozart's *Requiem*, one of the most moving and inspired works in the concert repertoire of sacred music. This Lenten musical offering, which uses the sacred texts of the Requiem Mass, will be performed in the church's sanctuary in a service of worship with hymns and prayers. All are welcome to this service to experience the beauty of this masterwork in the sacred space of First Presbyterian Church.

Mozart died at the early age of 35, and the *Requiem*, his last work, was left unfinished. Despite his illness, Mozart felt compelled to work on this masterwork, and on the eve of his death, he requested that the score be brought to him. He died on December 5, 1791. Mozart's twenty-five year old student, Franz Xaver Süssmayer, undertook the task of completing the *Requiem* based on Mozart's careful notes and discussions he had had with the Master. While other composers have attempted to complete the *Requiem*, the Mozart/Süssmayer work is widely accepted as the composition that best reflects Mozart's vision. This edition is the one that will be performed on March 14. In addition to the Requiem, Dr. Entriken will also perform one of Mozart's Church Sonatas for organ and orchestra.

Please mark your calendars now and invite friends to experience this inspiring work in First Presbyterian's beautiful sanctuary.

Portraits of Flowers by Susanna Beltrandi Artist Reception during Coffee Hour Sunday, March 7

“Portraits of Flowers” is Susanna Beltrandi’s first solo exhibition of oil paintings. Just as with portraits of people, these portraits of flowers reveal different characteristics, shapes and colors. Each flower has a personal story; it might be a flower from a community garden, a close-up of an orchid, a beautiful rose from someone’s garden, or simply a memory from the artist’s own garden. The small works in the show are quick studies of flowers painted in a much less controlled manner.

Susanna Beltrandi grew up in Switzerland, where she completed an apprenticeship as a draftsman before immigrating to the United States. At the School of Visual Arts in New York, she specialized in Textile Design. For many years she practiced that profession, mainly creating original designs painted on silk, before returning to school to study Fine Arts. Inspired by nature, she creates representational art in many different disciplines, including photography, watercolor, oil painting, and cyanotype printing.
