Our sanctuary and campus remain closed until further notice.

We are working to change the way we offer worship opportunities from the audio recordings of recent weeks to remote, livestream services. We won't be able to do so from the sanctuary, but we will at least be able to see one another's faces. Please stay tuned to *First Matters* for an update there. Our first such service was yesterday's mid-week evening Lenten service. It went fairly well, and we thank you for your understanding as we iron out glitches in formatting.

The Session continues to meet regularly, as do other boards, committees and action groups.

St. Joe's Soup Kitchen remains operational. Last Saturday, they switched to a modified feeding program, distributing bags of food – allowing a restricted number of guests upstairs to receive the take-out bags, and keeping guests spaced appropriately in the line outside.

Finally, though our staff is currently spread out over a wider part of the country (Bob and Marla Dunham are in North Carolina for now; Michael Shake is in Texas with Laura as they prepare to move out of their Dallas home into temporary quarters; and Mark Hostetter and his family are staying north of the city in Holmes), we continue to meet every morning by video teleconference, which is great comfort, no matter how many miles there are between us.
